Celebrating 30 Years

Did the small group of friends with a vision to keep Dorothy's story and her place in history alive in the minds of others know that they would ignite a flame that has sparked interest and inspiration in tens of thousands of visitors over the course of the last 30 years?

Since the Dorothy Molter Museum opened its doors on May 6, 1993 – what would have been Dorothy's 86th birthday — the organization and its leaders has evolved from a purely volunteer-run, historic house museum of Dorothy's Winter and Point Cabins into a staffed, educational and historic facility with three cabin exhibits, a nature trail, interpretive center with gift shop (and an indoor public bathroom), and a community pocket park available year-round for bird-watching.

The Dorothy Molter Memorial Foundation would not be what it is today doing business as the **Dorothy Molter Museum**

if it wasn't for that group of friends of Dorothy's. They took their vision and coordinated a massive 100% volunteer salvage project, collaborated with local government and businesses to obtain assistance to secure land and

in-kind support to rebuild Dorothy's cabins, and then dedicated their time, skill and energy to offer tours to visitors once the project was complete.

We all owe a debt of gratitude to this group of friends, these **Dorothy's Angels**, who took a story and made a legacy.

What a testament to Dorothy's impact on others that we are celebrating **30 Years** of mission-driven historic interpretation at the **Dorothy Molter Museum**.


From what started as a group of dedicated volunteers, many (if not all) of whom were friends of Dorothy's, offering first-person oral histories, we now employ a passionate group of seasonal

employees who derive their tour content not only from those early volunteers, but the Museum's rich collection of historic resources. That collection was originally built through the hard work of the Museum founders who coordinated the initial 1987 volunteer salvage effort to preserve the physical objects representing Dorothy's story. It continues to grow through the many friends, relatives and acquaintances of Dorothy's who have and continue to donate or share objects, papers, letters, photos and videos with the Museum.

As the Museum collection expands, the access to it continues to evolve as well. Once only accessible by visiting the Museum, technology has made our collection within reach to almost anyone with an interest. Museum staff and internet storytellers such as the news media and users of social media have helped take Dorothy's story global. Starting this spring, the Museum's collection database of thousands of items will also be available at the click of a button when we move from a software-based database system to a web-based collections catalogue. While we can't promise that every single record will be available to the public, we are very excited to finally have Dorothy's Guest Books available in digital form. It will still require a little work to "find your name" when looking but, now you won't have to visit the Museum to try. More information on this new database will be showcased at the Annual Fundraising Dinner on February 9 at the Grand Ely Lodge.


